Day 1 (Ushuaia)

Breakfast, transfer to El Calafate airport and morning flight to Ushuaia, the Capital Province of Tierra del Fuego. In the southern end of the Republic of Argentina, on the Isla Grande de Tierra del Fuego, there lies Ushuaia, the southernmost city in the world. Located on the Beagle Channel, it takes its name -which means "bay overlooking the West"- from the yámana tongue. Within the impressive frame made up by the sea, the forests, the lakes and the mountains, Ushuaia is a picturesque city with an important tourist services infrastructure, an elegant commercial center and an increasing social and cultural activity. Initially discovered by Magellan in 1520, Tierra del Fuego is a place of superlatives.

Meeting upon arrival and transfer to the hotel.

Day 2 (Tierra del Fuego National Park)

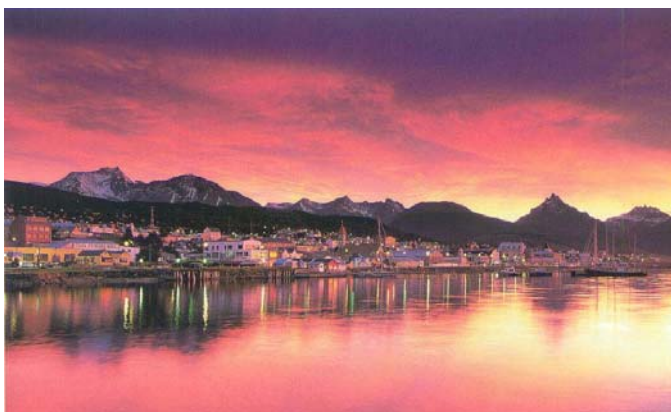
This park, unlike other Andean-Patagonian forests, possesses forests close to the sea coast. It is crossed by parallel mountain ranges in a north west to south east direction dividing the park in valleys of difficult access. The central part of lake Fagnano that drains into the Pacific ocean is specially protected in the park. In the south of the park is lake Roca, and in front of it mounts Cóndor and Guanaco. Lake Roca drains to the short and turbulent Lapataia river that flows into the sea through Lapataia bay (formed for the 6 km of sea coast over the Beagle Channel) The park has numerous traces of Yamana inhabitants prior to the arrival of European people to America. There are several parts in the park where you can find hummocks of piles of mussel-shells and bones accumulated together with utensiles.

After lunch, return to the city for navigation into the Beagle Channel in the afternoon as optional. Overnight (B)



Option: CANAL BEAGLE SAILING

This trip sets out from the tourist port of Ushuaia, where you will board either a modern catamaran. First, you will sail around the coast of the bay with a beautiful view of the most important buildings, such as the Marine Museum, the Museum of the End of the World, the industrial area, etc. In the background lie the majestic Mounts Olivia (Mount Olive), Cinco Hermanos (Five Brothers),



Mount Escarpados and the Encajonado river. The ship heads southwest to the center of the Beagle Channel, arriving at the Eclaireurs Light House, which stands on a small island in the archipelago of the same name. On one of these islets you can observe parts of the boat Monte Cervantes, which was wrecked in 1930. Further along, we head towards the Isla de Los Lobos (Sea Lions' Island), which we will circumnavigate for about 20 minutes. This will give us plenty of time to observe the magnificent sea lions that reside there. The silence that reigns in this environment reinforces the sentiment that you are truly at the end of the world. And finally, the last leg of our journey will take us to Isla de Los Pájaros (Bird Island), where magnificent imperial cormorants, Magellan cormorants, Fullman petrels, giant petrels, squas and albatross can be observed. All in all, 20 different species of marine birds.

Day 3 (Ushuaia – Buenos Aires)

After breakfast, transfer to Ushuaia airport and flight to Buenos Aires. Arriving to Buenos Aires and transfer to your hotel choice. Balance of day free to relax and get familiar with your surrounding.
